## Message from the Trustees

We are happy to present the annual report of the various activities of Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust during the year 2021-22.

The Trust was founded with specific Vision and Mission and we present the same to you in words.

**Vision :** Young generation from rural area can contribute significantly in nation building. In order to develop necessary curiosity & confidence amongst rural youth from their childhood, our trust shall work through supplemental educational activities with focus on prescribed syllabus.

**Mission :** Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust seeks to undertake activity based teaching among primary school students of rural areas in order to arouse their latent creativity and inquisitiveness.



The year 2021-22 passed amidst uncertainties due to Covid-19 virus. The terror of Covid-19 transmission prevailed in every sphere of the society.

We are glad to summarize the activities that the trust undertook in the areas of Health and Education in the year 2021-22:

**Health :** The trust has been rendering medical services for the **past 53 years** at concessional rates to the citizens of Dholka city as well as people residing in villages surrounding Dholka city through Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati Hospital which was established in the fond memory of revered Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati. Accomplished Doctors of the hospital render medical services using advanced medical equipments.

**Education :** With the intention to contain the transmission of Covid-19 virus among students, the academic year in primary schools did not commence as per the scheduled time table. The trust was in dilemma with regard to the kind of academic activities to be undertaken for students. However, the trust included in its annual planning such academic activities which imparted education without making a large number of students assemble at one place.



The academic activities which the trust undertook for year 2021-22 can be largely categorized into the following

## Quality Education

### (1) Academic work undertaken by the trust-appointed teachers:

**1.1 Street Education (Sheri shikshan) :** Trust-appointed teachers visited villages as per a fixed schedule and imparted education to weak students studying in standard **1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** at a public place of the village in small groups when the schools did not reopen at the onset of new academic year.

**1.2 School Education :** When schools reopened with the commencement of academic work, students studying in **1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>** standards of the schools selected under **Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna** were taught using activity based learning approach (**Pragna Abhigam**) whereas students studying in **3<sup>rd</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** standards were taught Maths and Science using the same approach.

**1.3 Revision of the syllabus and special classes for students weak in reading, writing and arithmetic (to reduce learning loss) :** Schools ran irregularly for the past 2 years due to Covid Pandemic. In this context, the trust conducted special classes to bring students (slow learners) into mainstream who were studying in standards **1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** and whose reading-writing-numeracy had weakened due to their prolonged absence from class.

### 1.4 Co-curricular activities were organized.

### 1.5 We organized academic activities which were directly beneficial to students as well as schools.

**(2) With the cooperation of Agastya International Foundation,** three units of Lab on bike (LOB) were used in **37 primary schools** of Dholka taluka to impart education in subjects of Maths and Science through hands-on activities.

**(3) Operation Vasanta (O.V):** Personality development activities are conducted for the native children in the village with Operation Vasanta centres.

**(4) Aavishkar Science Centre:** With the financial aid by Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust, Aavishkar Science Centre has been functioning for the **past 4 years** in the interior Maydhar village, Palitana taluka, Bhavnagar district where students of **6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** standards of primary schools surrounding Maydhar village come to learn science subject through activity.

**(5) Micro scholarship scheme:** From March 2022 this year, an inspiring micro scholarship scheme for students has been launched with the technical support of Sri Aurobindo Society, Puducherry.

In this way, the trust has made a humble effort to serve the society by undertaking different types of programmes and activities in the areas of Health and Primary Education in the year 2021-22.

We, the trustees, would like to express our most sincere gratitude to all loved ones, friends and well-wishers for their multifarious contribution in organizing different types of programmes and activities aimed at realizing the objectives of our trust.

# Quality Education

Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust launched *Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna* aspiring to enhance the quality of primary education in rural areas as homage to **late Prabhavatiben Bhagwati** to commemorate her birth centenary year in 2014.

With the intention to work towards enhancing the quality of primary education, thirteen primary schools of Dholka taluka, Ahmedabad district **from 2014** were selected in three phases under *Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna*.

With a view to achieve the goal of enhancing the quality of education in these thirteen primary schools, the trust plans different types of academic activities on annual basis every year.

## 1. Activity-based learning

**Mobile Unit for Activity-based learning:** The trust has established a mobile unit to facilitate Activity-based learning. The trust has recruited qualified and trained teachers for this unit. The trust has purchased a passenger auto rickshaw to take teachers regularly and timely to the selected primary schools as per the schedule along with academic resources to facilitate activity-based learning.

### 1. Academic work undertaken by the trust-appointed teachers:

#### 1.1 Street Education (*Sheri shikshan*) :

Teaching activities were undertaken in the villages as per bridge course for slow learners studying in standards **1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup>** from June 2021 to November 2021. For students of standard **6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** bridge course for slow learners was undertaken when the school remained closed from June 2021 to August 2021 and in January 2022. **A total of 960 students** from schools selected by the trust were covered in this project. The trust distributed Learning support literature in Maths and Science free of cost **among 10 slow learners per school (total 960 slow learners)** studying in standards **1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** of twelve schools.

## 1.2 School Education

From February 2022 to March 2022 when schooling started for all classes, activity-based teaching work was conducted in 13 schools selected under *Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna* as per a fixed schedule. Activity-based teaching was conducted for 2 days a month in every school in turns. Trust-appointed teachers facilitated teaching-learning activities in the subjects of Maths and Science in classes assigned to them. **Total 2450 students** benefitted from this.



## 1.3 Revision of the syllabus

Trust-appointed teachers reinforced the second-term syllabus taught to students of standards 3<sup>rd</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> with the help of Quizola (a game to find answers of given questions). Revision of syllabus was also undertaken.

## 1.4 Co-curricular activities

Limited co-curricular activities which could be conducted virtually at school level were organized in schools selected under *Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna* for the year 2021-22, the details of which are shared in table 1.

## 2. Activity-based Learning in collaboration with Agastya International Foundation

With the financial aid by the trust, academic activities managed by Agastya International Foundation are carried out in **35 villages of Dholka taluka**.

### 2.1 Activity based learning in Science:

Since February 2019, 2 units of hands-on activity kit **Science – Lab on a Bike** developed by **Agastya International Foundation** are used in **24 primary schools** of Dholka taluka to teach Science through activities. **In all 2530 students** studying in **standard 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** were taught Science through these kits.





## 2.2 Activity based learning in Mathematics:

Since September 2018, one unit of hands-on activity kit Math – Lab on a bike developed by Agastya International Foundation are used in **13 primary schools of Dholka taluka** to teach Maths through activities. In all **873 students** studying in standard 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> were taught Maths through these kits.





### 3. Operation Vasanta Activity (O.V)

With the financial support of the trust, OV centres have been started in **16 villages of Dholka taluka** under **Operation Vasanta (O.V)** program managed by Agastya International Foundation. These centers have been started with the intention to increase community participation in education as well as for the comprehensive development of rural children. Activities of OV centres gained limelight especially during the period when the schools remained closed. In the year 2021-22, more than **400 children visited these centres on daily basis** and participated in various activities.

### 4. Aavishkar Science Centre, Maydhar

With the financial aid by Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust, Aavishkar Science Centre has been established on the premises of Pandit Sukhlalji Lok Vidhyalaya Kendra managed by Lokbharti Gramvidyapith Trust at Maydhar village, Palitana taluka, Bhavnagar district of Gujarat since June 2019.

Students studying in standard **5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** of more than **50 primary schools** located in the rural areas of Palitana, Talaja and Shihor talukas around Maydhar village come to the science center and stay for the day to study the units of their science courses by doing hands on activities.

Duly qualified, trained and experienced Science teachers impart knowledge of Science as prescribed in the curriculum by the government with the help of Hands-on Activity Kit in this Science Centre.

#### 1. Activity based teaching for Science subject:

Teachers of Aavishkar Science Centre went to students' villages and undertook teaching-learning activities of the bridge course when schools remained closed between April 2021 and September 2021. During this period of six months, Science teachers of Aavishkar Science Centre, Maydhar taught **Science to 4166 students studying in standard 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>**.

When schooling for students studying in **standard 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** started in October 2021, the primary schools in the surrounding rural areas of Maydhar started bringing students and teachers to Aavishkar Science Centre every month as per a fixed schedule to learn the subject of Science.

In this way, **5454 students** studying in standard **6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** of more than **50 primary schools** located in three talukas around Maydhar village visited the science centre and were taught Science through hands- on activities by teachers of the centre.



## 2. Celebration of 'Vigyan Sarvatra Pujiyate'

In connection with '*Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav*' celebrating 75th anniversary of India's independence, 75 centers across the country were selected to organize various programmes on Science on the theme of '*Vigyan Sarvatra Pujiyate*' for a week. In this context, three centres in Gujarat were selected; the one being Lok Vigyan Kendra of Lok Bharti, Sanosara. Following the selection of Lok Vigyan Kendra of Lok Bharti, Sanosara, Science Week was celebrated from **22<sup>nd</sup> February to 28<sup>th</sup> February 2022** at Aavishkar Science Centre, Maydhar. During this week, programmes like **Science Fair, Sky Watching and a Seminar** for teachers teaching Science in primary schools around Maydhar were organized. **150 students of 46 schools** presented models in this fair. **3105 students from 46 primary schools who visited the center regularly dropped by to see the Science Fair.**



## 5. Micro Scholarship Scheme

With the technical support of Sri Aurobindo Society, Puducherry, the trust started Micro scholarship scheme from March 2022. Under this scheme, the students of standard **1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>** studying in schools selected under *Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna*, can avail of Micro scholarship of **upto Rs 1000/-** per month by taking curriculum-based online quiz in 5 subjects (Maths, Science, Social Studies, English and Hindi) every month. According to this scheme, if a student takes 20 quizzes of 5 subjects with 4 quiz in every subject as per his/her standard and scores more than 80% marks in each quiz, then the student gets a **maximum scholarship of Rs 1000/- per month**. The main aim of this scheme is to motivate students to work hard in studies on their own, while availing financial help of a small amount in the form of scholarship every month. The student is likely to work hard on his/her own while seeking guidance of his/her teacher to understand the topic better in any subject with the hope to take benefit of scholarship every month by taking online quiz after thorough preparation.

### Distribution of Happiness Kit

Due to the lockdown during the Covid-19 Pandemic, many families had issues even in getting two meals a day as they lost their source of income. InspiOn Engineering Private Limited gave donation to Akshay Patra in order to feed the affected, needy, poor families. With the donation received from the company, Akshay Patra distributed **545 Happiness kits** among vulnerable families through primary schools of Gandhinagar. This happiness kit had **20 essential items** which included food grains / groceries, nutriment, immunity boosters, study material for children as

well as personal hygiene care items.

**545 happiness kits contained material equivalent to 10,900 meals for 545 beneficiaries.**

## Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital, Dholka

The vision and mission of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital, Dholka is as under:

**Vision:** Every human life is a precious God-given gift. We at Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital will look after the health and well-being of the underprivileged rural population with the help of advanced technology, expert specialists, excellent and caring health services at concessional rates without any discrimination of caste and religion.

**Mission:** Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital will provide the underprivileged rural population living in and around Dholka with advanced services in gynaecology, paediatrics and any other medical branches. Medical experts and the hospital staff rendering services shall always be compassionate and transparent in their treatment of a patient.

For the **past 53 years**, Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital has made available modern health facilities to the people residing in and around rural areas of Dholka city at concessional rates in the fields of Gynecology, Pediatrics, Medicine and Dermatology. Apart from this, the hospital offers examination, diagnosis and treatment for common ailments; if the patient needs more intensive treatment, then the hospital also gives proper guidance and advice as to where the patient will get better and right treatment.

Tests necessary for diagnosis of a disease are done in the pathology laboratory of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital at the most concessional rates in Dholka. The medical shop of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital provides medicines to the patients at the reasonable rate.

For the past 53 years, Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital has been known in and around Dholka city for diagnosing and treating gynecological ailments at concessional rates. **In the year 2021-22, 1837 babies** were born in the



maternity ward of the hospital with an **average of 153 child-births every month**. Due to postpartum and postnatal care rendered by the hospital, the **mortality rate of mother (MMR)** has come down to naught and the **infant mortality rate (IMR)** has also been contained. As per the **state government, the infant mortality rate is pegged at 40 per 1000 child births**. It is indeed a **matter of pride and pleasure for us that infant mortality rate at Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital this year has been restricted to 1 per 1000 child births**.

## Activities by Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital in 2021-22

**1. Renovation of the hospital:** The trustees of the hospital have been persistently endeavouring to provide the patients coming to the hospital with superior treatment and facilities with the help of advanced, ultra-modern technology. The building which houses Out Patient Department (OPD) of the hospital is being expanded and renovated this year to provide the patients with improved facilities and up-to-date treatment.

A new x-ray department has been started in the hospital from February 2022 this year. The patients visiting the hospital shall be able to take advantage of the services of this department at reasonable rates. The hospital has received donation from Dholka Nagarpalika to install the latest X-Ray machine in the department.

Ample parking arrangement has also been made so that the patients visiting the hospital can park their vehicles properly on the hospital campus.

**2. Medical Camp:** Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital organizes Medical camps in villages surrounding Dholka city regularly every year. In the year 2021-22, **14 Diagnosis and Treatment Camps were organized in 14 villages** surrounding Dholka city.

Every patient coming to this camp was provided with necessary medicines, pathology test, ECG test, and other medical services for free. **In all, 897 patients availed** the essential health services at the camp.

In fond remembrance of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati, a special Medical Camp was organized at the hospital on 06/03/2022. In this camp, **200 patients** suffering from various diseases were examined and given medicines free of charge.

**3. Gynecology - Diagnosis, Treatment and Awareness Camp:** The Gynecology department of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital has been rendering the best treatment to women patients at concessional rate since long. In this regard, the hospital organized **4 Gynecology Diagnosis and Treatment camps** this year wherein **117 women patients** availed of health services.

Our doctors enlightened Asha workers, Anganwadi workers, rural pregnant women and their family members of **20 villages** of Dholka taluka on different diseases, importance of balanced diet, maintaining personal hygiene for health and so on.
