Message from the Trustees

Here is a report on various activities undertaken by Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust during the year 2022-23.

Behind every good social activity there is always a specific Vision. To achieve the Vision a Mission Statement is necessary and the mission succeeds only when planned activities are duly implemented. We would like to put in words, the Vision and Mission that our trust was established with.

Vision: Young generation from rural area can contribute significantly in nation building. In order to develop necessary curiosity & confidence amongst rural youth from their childhood, our trust shall work through supplemental educational activities with focus on prescribed syllabus.

Mission: Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust seeks to undertake activity based teaching among primary school students of rural areas in order to arouse their latent creativity and inquisitiveness.

We are happy to summarize for you the activities that the trust undertook in the areas of Health and Education in the year 2022-23.

Health: The trust has been rendering medical services for the past **54 years** at concessional rates to the citizens of Dholka city as well as people residing in villages surrounding Dholka city through **Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital** which was established with family funds in the fond memory of revered late **Shrimati Santokba**



Bhagwati. Accomplished doctors at the hospital render services using highly advanced medical equipments.

With the intention to provide better treatment to the patients visiting the hospital, there was an impetus for modernizing and expanding the health services and facilities rendered to the patients this year. New departments for treating patients in the hospital were launched and buildings of certain departments were renovated.

In September 2022, the State Bank of India, Gujarat, donated an ambulance to the hospital, enabling the hospital to provide patients with ambulance

services at concessional rates. The trustees express their gratitude to the State Bank of India.

Education: Education plays a pivotal role in the development of an individual. Nobel laureate economist Amartya Sen is of the opinion that primary education holds the key to a country's development. The trust initiated the '**Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojana**' in select government-run primary schools of Dholka taluka, Ahmedabad district, with the aim of enhancing the quality of education in rural area primary schools. Various curricular activities were organized under this scheme in the year 2022-23.

With the intention of providing support to schools selected under the '**Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojana**' in their effort to improve primary education, the trust intends to seek technical support and guidance from **Dr. K R Shroff Foundation, Ahmedabad**, starting next year.

The academic activities which the trust undertook for year 2022-23 largely included

Quality Education:

(1) Academic work undertaken by the trust-appointed teachers:

1.1 School Education

When academic activities began in the primary schools selected under '**Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna**,' students in **1st and 2nd** standards were taught using an activity-based learning approach known as '**Pragna Abhigam**.' For students in 3rd to 8th standards, the same approach was used for teaching Maths and Science.

1.2 Special classes for slow learners in reading, writing and numeracy

Certain students who are weak (slow learners) in reading, writing and numeracy find it more difficult to cope with academic work in the classroom. In order to bring such slow learners up to speed, in main stream by giving them more practice, trust has started conducting special classes focused on improving reading, writing, and numeracy skills.

1.3 Co-curricular activities were also organized.

1.4 Following curricular activities were organized which were directly beneficial to students as well schools.

(2) Cooperation of Agastya International Foundation in activity-based learning: With the cooperation of Agastya International Foundation, three units of Lab on bike were deployed in **37 primary schools** of Dholka taluka to teach subjects of Mathematics and Science through activities.

(3) Operation Vasanta: Under the Operation Vasanta (OV) programme, different types of personality development activities are conducted in **16 Centers** for the children of the villages. The Center plays an important role in encouraging children who drop out of school to return to school.

(4) Aavishkar Science Center: With the financial aid by the Trust, Aavishkar Science Center has been functioning for the **past 5 years** in Maydhar village, Palitana taluka, Bhavnagar district. **Students of 6th to 8th standards studying in more than 65 primary schools** around Aavishkar Science Center, Maydhar village visit the Center to learn science through activity.

(5) Micro scholarship scheme: Micro scholarship scheme for students has been started from March, 2022 with the technical support of Sri Aurobindo Society, Puducherry.

In this way, the trust has made a modest attempt to serve the society by undertaking different types of programmes and activities in the areas of Health and Primary Education in the year 2022-23.

We, the trustees, express our sincerest gratitude to all loved ones, friends and well-wishers for diverse contribution in organizing different types of programmes and activities aimed at realizing the objectives of our trust.

Quality Education

Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust launched **Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna** with the intention to enhance the quality of primary education in rural areas as a tribute to late **Prabhavatiben Bhagwati** to celebrate her birth centenary year in 2014.

Twelve government-run primary schools of Dholka taluka, Ahmedabad district were selected in three phases under Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna with the intention to work towards enhancing the quality of primary education in rural areas. The trust organizes various curricular activities in these **12 primary schools** every year to achieve the goal of enhancing the quality of education. The details of curricular activities undertaken in the year **2022-23** is as under:

1. Activity-based learning

Mobile Unit for Activity-based learning:

The trust has established a mobile unit to facilitate Activity-based learning. The trust has recruited duly qualified and trained teachers for this unit. The trust has purchased a passenger auto rickshaw to transport teachers to the primary schools along with academic resources to facilitate activity-based learning.

1. Academic work undertaken by the trust-appointed teachers:

1.1 School Education:

Activity-based teaching work was planned in **12 schools** selected under **Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna** as per the monthly schedule visiting every school twice a month. Trust-appointed teachers facilitated teaching-learning activities in the subjects of Maths and Science in classes assigned to them, **benefiting a total of 2,450 students.**

1.2 Special coaching classes in reading-writing-numeracy for slow learners:



Special coaching classes in reading-writing-numeracy for those students who were weak (slow learners) in reading-writing-numeracy and were studying in standards 1st to 8th in the primary schools selected under **Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna** were conducted 2-3 hours before the regular school hours. All the young graduates from the village who volunteered to teach slow learners in these classes were given honorarium. In the year 2022-2023, special classes for reading-writing-numeracy were conducted from **July 2022 to March 2023** in **nine primary schools** selected under the project. A **total of 436 students** attended these special classes. Since weak students needed continuous practice in reading-writing-numeracy, **436 students** from these special classes were given **practice books for number writing and letter writing for self-study free of cost by the trust.**

2. Activity-based Learning in collaboration with Agastya International Foundation

With financial Sponsorship from by the trust, Agastya International Foundation conducted the following academic activities in **36 villages of Dholka taluka of Ahmedabad District**.

2.1 Hands-on Education in the subject of Science:

Since February 2019, **two units of the Science Lab on a Bike**, developed by Agastya International Foundation to teach Science through hands-on activities, have been utilized in primary schools in Dholka taluka. By the end of March 2023, **a total of 2,980 students from 24 primary schools**, studying in standards 6th to 8th, were taught the subject of Science through in-person activities using two units by visiting one school twice each month.



2.2 Hands-on Education in the subject of Maths:

Since September 2018, **one unit of the Maths Lab on a Bike**, developed by Agastya International Foundation, has been used in **11 primary schools** in Dholka taluka to teach the subject of Maths through hands-on activities. By the end of March 2023, **a total of 900 students from 11 primary schools**, studying in **standards 6th to 8th**, were taught the subject of Maths through in-person activities using two units by visiting one school twice each month.

3. Operation Vasanta Activity (O.V)

With the financial support of the trust, **16 Operation Vasanta Centers** have been established in **16 villages** of Dholka taluka as part of the Operation Vasanta (OV) program managed by Agastya International Foundation. These Centers were initiated with the goal of increasing community participation in education and promoting the comprehensive development of rural children. In the year 2022-23, **more than 400 children** visited these sixteen Centers on a daily basis and actively participated in various activities.

4. Aavishkar Science Center, Maydhar

With the financial support by Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust, **Aavishkar Science Center** has been established on the premises of Pandit Sukhlalji Lok Vidhyalaya Kendra managed by Lokbharti Gramvidyapith Trust at Maydhar village, Palitana taluka, Bhavnagar district since **June 2019**.

Students studying in standard 6th to 8th from more than **65 government-run as well as private primary schools** located in the rural areas of Palitana, Talaja and Shihor talukas around Maydhar village come to the science Center at their own expense and stay for the whole day to study the units of their science courses by engaging in hands-on activities.

Duly qualified, trained and experienced Science teachers impart knowledge of Science subject as prescribed in the curriculum by the government using Hands-on Activity Kit in this Science Center.

Teaching Science through activities:

Starting from June 2022, when the academic year for students in standards 6th to 8th commenced, in accordance with the schedule prepared by Aavishkar Vigyan Kendra, both government and non-government primary schools in the rural areas around Maydhar have been sending students and teachers in their vehicles every month to engage in science-related activities at the Vigyan Kendra.

In the 2022-23, **over 7,300 students of standards 6th to 8th, hailing from more than 65 primary schools across three talukas surrounding Maydhar village**, visited Aavishkar Vigyan Kendra, Maydhar where the teachers at the Center taught the science subjects through activities.

5. Micro Scholarship Scheme

With the technical support of Sri Aurobindo Society, Puducherry, the trust launched Micro scholarship scheme from **March 2022**. Under this scheme, the students of standard 1st to 8th studying in schools selected under *Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna*, can avail of **Micro scholarship of Rs 1000/- per month** by taking curriculum-based online quiz in **5 subjects**: Maths, Science, Social Studies, English and Hindi every month. According to this scheme, if a student takes **20 quizzes** in these five subjects, with **four quizzes** in each subject corresponding to his/her standard, and **scores more than 80% in each quiz**, then he/she can receive a maximum scholarship of Rs. 1000/- per month.

The main aim of this scheme is to motivate students to wade through studies on their own while receiving modest financial help in the form of a monthly scholarship. The student is encouraged to work painstakingly, seeking guidance from his/her teacher to understand the subjects better with the hope of benefitting from monthly scholarship by taking online quizzes after thorough preparation.

In the year 2022-23, as part of the implementation of the first phase of the scheme, the Auro Micro Scholarship scheme was launched for a total of **677 students from standards 4th to 8th in 5 primary schools** included under the trust's project. Due to technical limitations of the Auro Scholar App (APP) for conducting online quizzes under this scheme as well as a lack of awareness among the students about the scheme, it failed to yield significant results.

To make students aware about the micro-scholarship scheme, a special awareness campaign program was organized by the trust and Auro Society visiting 5 schools under this project in December 2022 and January 2023. Quiz competitions covering general knowledge and the identification of their taluka, district, and state according to the students' levels were conducted in this programme.

Students were encouraged to participate in the micro-scholarship scheme quiz by giving away cash prizes and certificates to the winning students.

By March 2023, **52 students had received a total scholarship of Rs 12,000 under this scheme.**

Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital, Dholka

Vision: Human life is very precious. We at santokba hospital- shall treat our patients with best healthcare facilities, diagnosis & providing related effective treatment by expert doctors; extend compassionate & quality treatment from medical staff to each patient irrespective of his religion, caste or weak economic condition. Charges for treatment shall always be affordable even to those patients from weaker section of society & who may be below poverty lines.

Mission: Santokba Hospital shall extend-modern health care facilities with focus on gynecology, pediatrics to poor patients, residing around Dholka. All patients irrespective of their religion or caste will be treated with great care & compassion by expert doctors & hospital medical staff. Most affordable & uniform rates will charged to every patient.

For **the past 54 years**, Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital has been making available modern health facilities to the people residing in and surrounding rural areas of Dholka city at concessional rates in the fields of Gynecology, Pediatrics, Medicine and Dermatology. Apart from this, the hospital offers examination, diagnosis and treatment for common ailments; if the patient needs more intensive treatment, then the hospital also gives proper guidance and advice as to where the patient will get better and right treatment.

For the past 54 years, Smt. Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital in Dholka city, Ahmedabad district, has been steadfastly providing advanced healthcare services to the citizens of Dholka and the surrounding rural community in the areas of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatrics, General Medicine, Radiology (X-ray and sonography), Orthopedics, and Dermatology, all of which operate with the goal of delivering quality care at concessional rates. Apart from this, the hospital offers

examination, diagnosis and treatment for common ailments; if the patient needs more intensive treatment, then the hospital also gives proper guidance and advice as to where the patient will get better and right treatment.

Tests necessary for the diagnosis of a disease are being conducted in the pathology laboratory of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital at concessional rates compared to other hospitals in Dholka. The medical shop at Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital provides medicines to patients at reasonable prices.

For the past 54 years, Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital has

been known in and around Dholka city for diagnosing and treating gynecological ailments at concessional rates. In the year 2022-23, **a total of 2,015 babies** were born in the maternity ward of the hospital, averaging **168 childbirths every month**. Thanks to the postpartum and postnatal care provided by the hospital, **the maternal mortality rate (puerperal mortality) has dropped to zero**, and the infant mortality rate has been effectively controlled. Every baby born in the hospital is given a free baby set (consisting of a plastic mat, apparels, nappy, and cap) as a welcome gift from the hospital.

Activities by Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital in 2022-23

1. Renovation of the hospital: The trustees of the hospital have been persistently endeavouring to provide the patients coming to Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital with superior treatment and facilities with the

help of advanced, ultra-modern technology. The building which houses OPD of the hospital is being expanded and renovated this year to provide the patients with improved facilities and up-to-date treatment.

The trustees of the hospital have been persistently endeavoring to provide the patients coming to Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital with superior treatment and facilities through the use of advanced, ultra-modern technology. This year, the building housing the hospital's outpatient department (OPD) underwent expansion and renovation to offer patients improved facilities and up-to-date treatment.

Facilities for patients admitted to the hospital for common ailments have been augmented. The number of wards and special rooms for women coming for delivery, as well as the facilities provided in them, has been increased.

In order to provide **24x7 services** of experienced gynecologists and pediatricians to the patients coming to the hospital for treatment, a new comfortable residential arrangement has been created for the doctors on the hospital campus itself. A new orthopedic department has been started in the hospital since July 2023. This department will examine and diagnose patients with various bone-related problems. In this department, the services of a well-known and experienced orthopedic surgeon will be available at a concessional rate for 2 days a month.

In September 2022, an ambulance was gifted to the hospital by the State Bank of India, Ahmedabad. Patients can benefit from this ambulance service at a concessional rate.

2. Diagnosis and Treatment Camp: Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital regularly organizes Diagnosis and Treatment Camps in the villages surrounding Dholka city every year. In the year 2022-23, **a total of 45 Diagnosis and Treatment Camps were organized in 42 villages around Dholka city**. Every patient who attended the camp received necessary medicines, pathology tests, ECG tests, and other medical services free of charge. **In total, 4,593 patients** availed themselves of essential health care services at the camp.

3. Gynecology Treatment Camp: Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital has been providing treatment to thousands of women over the years through its Department of Gynecology as a part of which, the hospital organized a camp offering Hysterectomy Surgery at an affordable rate for women with uterine problems. During this camp, **six female patients** underwent **uterine surgery**.
