# **Message from the Trustees**

Business and industrial houses can work towards the betterment of the society by contributing to the development of the deprived and neglected class of the society by way of social and moral obligation. With such objectives, our family doyens established this trust. To uphold their tradition of noble legacy, the trust has been rendering medical treatment to economically weaker section for the past 51 years through Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital. Besides this, the trust has adopted 13 primary schools of Dholka taluka and the village of Kesargadh with intention of improving over all hygienic & cleanliness condtions.

With the co-operation of Agastya International Foundation the activities of the trust under 'Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna' have expanded from 13 villages of Dholka taluka to 37 villages this year. With the financial aid by the trust, an 'Aavishkar Science Center' has been established at Maydhar village, Palitana taluka, Bhavnagar district this year.

This had been golden jubilee year of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital (1969-2019). In celebration of golden jubilee year, the trust organized a reunion of the former as well as the current employees of the hospital wherein the experiences to the path of development of the hospital were exchanged. The trust motivated the staff by hailing them wholeheartedly on the occasion.

## Health:

The trust has been rendering medical services at concessional rates to the citizens of Dholka city as well as people residing in villages surrounding Dholka city through "Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital" established using the subvention from our family granted in fond memory of revered Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati.

We are indeed happy to share that **1797 deliveries** could be facilitated this year due to very good patient care at the hospital with just 01 maternal death recorded. The state government has targeted to bring infant mortality rate (IMR) to 40 per thousand children born. However, this year the hospital has restricted **mortality rate** to **01 per thousand children** born which is a matter of happiness and pride for us.

#### **Education:**

We believe that education is the driving force of human life. Education plays an important role in the development of an individual. Very specifically, primary education forms the foundation of a child's personality development. As a commemoration of the **birth centenary year** of our revered family doyen Shrimati Prabhavati Bhagwati in 2014, the trust initiated *'Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna'* with the intention to bring about improvement in the quality of primary education systematically. To make primary education rich in quality and effective, the trust had implemented *'Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna'* in 13 primary schools of Dholka taluka gradually. We are happy to inform that the programme has been expanded to primary schools of total 37 remote villages of Dholka taluka in the academic year 2019-20. 'Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna' will finish six years in May 2020 and enter the seventh year.

To make primary education rich in quality, engaging and comprehensive, the trust has adopt several new approaches in teaching-learning activity. Instead of relying on textbooks for education and accepting the novel approach of 'Activity-based Learning', the approach of teaching difficult subjects like Maths and Science through activities has been put in implementation since 2019.

The Trust has initiated an effort to teach both the subjects in the classroom through various activities of Mathematics and Science subjects (**Hands on activity kit**) prepared by a nationally renowned institute Agastya International Foundation working in the field of education. The method of teaching Mathematics through activity is being very enthusiastically welcomed by the teachers and students of the schools under the project.

With the financial aid by the trust, Agastya International Foundation has set up 10 centres in 10 villages of

**Dholka taluka** for the inclusive development of rural children under the programme entitled **Operation Vasanta**.

Besides this, with the financial aid by the trust and technical guidance by Agastya International

Foundation, an 'Aavishkar Science Center' has been established on the premises of Pandit Sukhlalji Lok Vidhyalaya Kendra managed by Lokbharti Gramvidyapith Trust at Maydhar village, Palitana taluka, Bhavnagar district in June 2019.

In this way, our trust has made a humble attempt to cater to the needs of the society by undertaking activities in areas of Health and Hygiene, Quality of Primary Education and too some

# Quality Education

Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust had launched 'Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna' in the birth centenary year of our revered family doyen Shrimati Prabhavati Bhagwati in 2014 to commemorate her fond memories.

The trust undertook the following three types of activities to realize the objective of making education rich in quality in 13 primary schools of Dholka taluka selected under 'Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna' (1) Activity based learning (2) Co-curricular activities (3) Academic activities which are directly useful to students as well as schools

# (1) Activity based learning

## (1.1) Activity based learning through mobile unit

The trust has appointed 5 trained and qualified teachers to undertake activity based learning through

mobile unit. The trust has bought a passenger auto rickshaw to ferry the trust appointed teachers to schools with required tool kit to conduct activity based learning regularly and punctually as per the prescribed time table.

The trust appointed teachers utilized the following resources and approaches from standard 1 to 8 to undertake activity based learning in the academic year 2019-20:





- (1) The trust appointed teachers conducted unit based activities in groups using resource material developed by NCERT in the line of *Pragya* Approach by the government of Gujarat to undertake activity based learning in **standards 1 and 2.**
- (2) In **standards 3 to 5**, the teachers carried out activities mentioned in NCERT compiled books of various subjects as well as taught Mathematics through activities using **Hands-on Activity Kit** for Mathematics prepared by Agastya International Foundation.











(3) In standards 6 to 8, the trust appointed teachers executed activity based learning in the subject of Science unit-wise using **Hands-on Activity Kit** for Science prepared by Agastya International Foundation. As per the prescribed schedule, the trust appointed teachers visited the schools selected under the project twice a month and undertook activity based learning in various subjects as per the time-table of the school curriculum.



The trust appointed teachers conducted activity-based learning for 2465 students studying from standard 1 to 8, the details of which are mentioned in table 1.

## (1.2) Activity based learning in collaboration with Agastya International Foundation

With the financial support of the trust, the following three teaching-learning activities have been implemented by Agastya International Foundation. The trust has made financial provision to ensure that these activities can be carried out uninterruptedly for a longer period of time.

## 1.2.1 Teaching Mathematics using activities

The trained teacher of Agastya International Foundation has started teaching Mathematics using the study material (Hands on activity kit) developed by the Foundation. **639 activities** were conducted for **905 students** studying in standard **6 to 8 in 13 primary schools** of Dholka taluka by March 2020.

## 1.2.2 Teaching Science using activities

The subject of Science was taught through activities using study material (Hands on activity kit) developed by Agastya International Foundation. Its two units of Science – Lab on a Bike were used in **24 schools** of Dholka taluka from February 2019. 200 activities of Science were conducted for **7247 students** studying **in standard 6 to 8 in 24 primary schools** of Dholka taluka by two trained teachers of Agastya International Foundation until March 2020.







## 1.2.3 Operation Vasanta (OV) Activity Centre

Children Activity Centres have been started under Agastya International Foundation's Operation Vasanatha (OV) program in **10 out of the 24 villages** in Dholka taluka where Science subject is taught through activities in primary schools by teachers of Agastya International Foundation. Activities for comprehensive development of







children are conducted for 2-3 hours daily in activity centres under Operation Vasanta by qualified and trained volunteers of the village for children belonging to the age group of **7 to 14 years** (Children studying in standard 1 to 8) as per the village's schedule. Long-term financial planning has been made by the trust to ensure that these activity centres continue to function.

On an average 250 children visited these 10 activity centres every month and participated in around 100 activities leading to their comprehensive development in the year 2019-20.

# (2) Co-Curricular Activities

Under 'Pragatishil Shaala Vikas Yojna', the trust appointed teachers organized 9 cocurricular activities by allocating total 98 academic days wherein 6208 students from standard 1 to 8 participated in these activities enthusiastically. The details of it are shared in table no. 2 given below it.

'Aavishkar Science Center' has been established on the premises of Pandit Sukhlalji Lok Vidhyalaya Kendra managed by Lokbharti Gram Vidyapith Trust at Maydhar village, Palitana taluka, Bhavnagar district on 17 June 2019 with the financial aid by Shri Hiralal Bhagwati Charitable Trust and technical guidance by Agastya International Foundation as well as by making academic resources required for establishing a science centre available. Students of standard 6 to 8 studying in Bhavnagar

District Panchayat managed government primary schools as well as government recognized private schools located in Palitana, Shihor and Talaja talukas visit Science Centre 4 times a year for the whole day as per the schedule to understand the subject of Science through activities as prescribed in their unit activities of Science syllabus. The qualified teachers trained by Agastya International Foundation impart knowledge of Science subject through activities in this Science Centre.







From June 2019 to March 2020, a total of **9720 students** (5552 boys and 4168 girls) studying in **Std.** 6 to 8 of 52 government and private primary schools in three talukas of Bhavnagar district and 50 science teachers have benefitted from Avishkar Vigyan Kendra, Mayadhar. The trust has also made financial plans to keep this science center operational for a long time.

# Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital, Dholka

For the past **51 years**, Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital has operationalized Gynecology, Pediatrics, Medicine and Dermatology wards with the intention to render modern health facilities to the people residing in Dholka as well as in rural areas of Dholka taluka. Apart from this, the hospital offers examination, diagnosis and treatment for common ailments; it also gives patients proper guidance and advice if there is need for further intensive treatment. In the year 2019-20, **on an average 150 infants are born every month** in the maternity ward of the hospital. A significant **control over infant mortality rate** has been observed due to propercare taken of mother as well as child's health.

Necessary tests are being done in the pathology laboratory of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital at rates more concessional than being done in other hospitals of Dholka and the medical shop of Shrimati



Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital provides medicines to the patients at the economic rate. Treatment is given free of cost to families below poverty line under Gujarat Government's Chiranjeevi and Balsakha Yojna. The trust gives a baby set (consisting of plastic mat, apparels, diaper and cap) free of cost to the infants born in the hospital.

## Activities by Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital in 2019-20

## 1. Medical Camp


Medical camps are regularly organized once a week in the villages around Dholka by the expert doctors of Shrimati Santokba Bhagwati General Hospital to provide basic health facilities to the extremely poor families of the rural areas at their village. The patients who come at the camp are examined by the expert and experienced doctors of the hospital and the required medicine is given free of cost as a part of basic treatment. In year 2019-20, 3986 patients were examined and basic treatment was given in total 46 medical camps conducted in 22 villages around Dholka city. In 19 villages around Dholka city, 292 reading glasses were distributed to 292 persons at 50% reduced rate.




## 2. Hypothyroidism test for the infants (Test to arrest mental retardation among infants)

Certain defects in the child at the time of birth can make the child mentally-retarded. Such defect is known as Congenital Hypothyroidism. However, this defect can be diagnosed with a pathological test within 24 hours of the child's birth. Blood sample of every new born child is sent to a Pathology lab at Bengaluru. Immediate treatment is administered to the child if the test is found positive; so that life long intellectual disability and

growth failure in the child can be arrested. Such treatment (costing Rs. 30-50 per month) ensures that the child can lead a normal life as a child as well as an adult. The hospital has received the adequate grant for this test and so, The pathological test is conducted Free of cost. There has been a total expenditure of Rs 3,11,100/- for the year 2019-20 towards this test of Hypothyroidism, the details of which are as under:

# Rural Women Empowerment Activities by the trust

## 1. Forming self-help group:

Women's self-help groups were formed in the villages under the project. A total of 6 self-help groups have been formed in the three villages in which 82 women members have collectively saved Rs 85,200 in a year.

## 2. Bank Loan:

Guidance was given to women members of Selfhelp groups of project area to get loan from Textile Traders Cooperative Bank, Ahmedabad to start a small scale business for earning supplementary income. 12 women beneficiaries have availed of the loan facility aggregating to Rs. 5, 90,000.

## 3. Self-employment and Training:

The trust organized 5 such capacity building activities during the year which may help rural women in their business and self-employment.
